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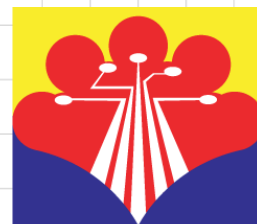

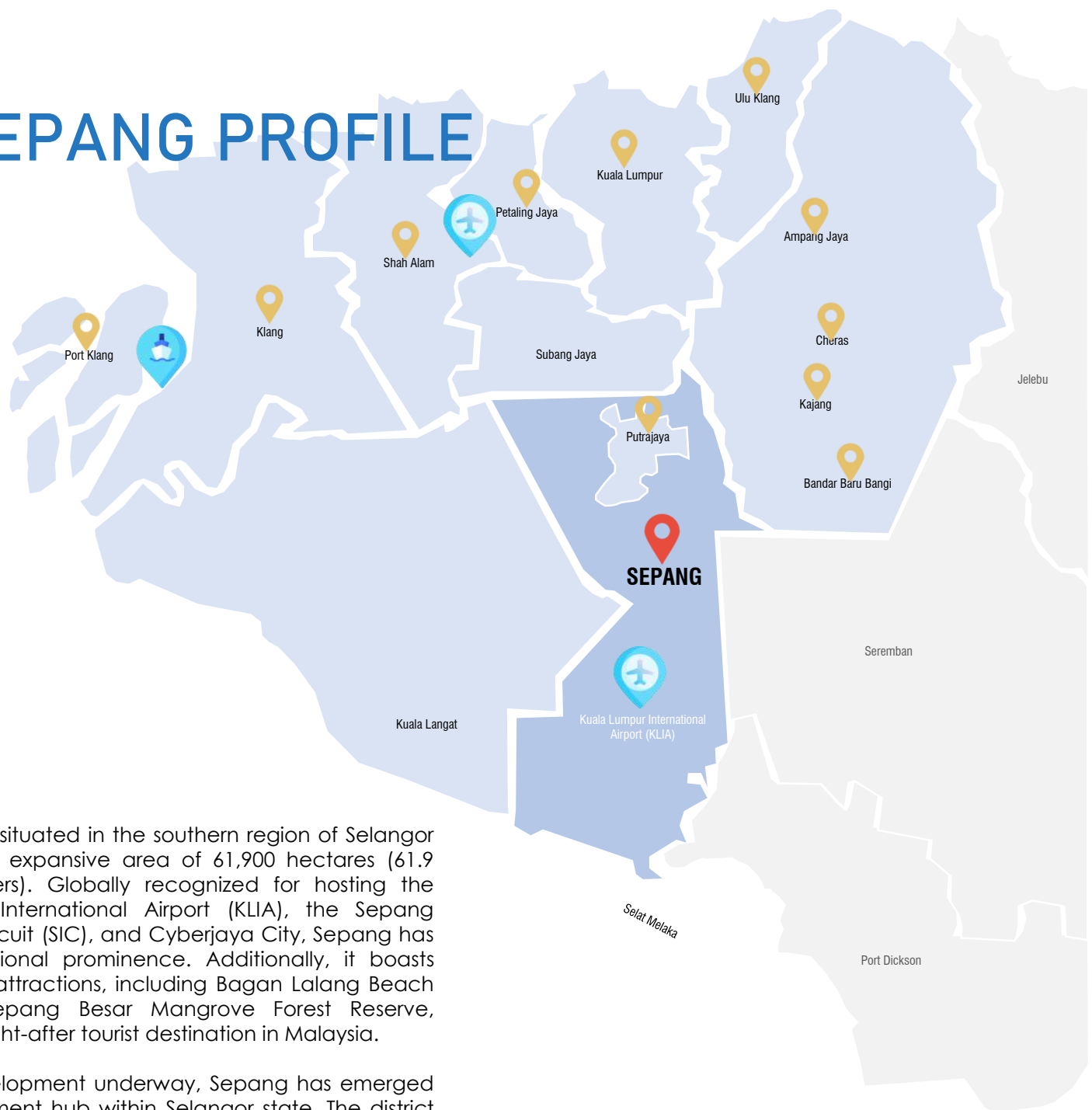

2.0 SEPANG PROFILE



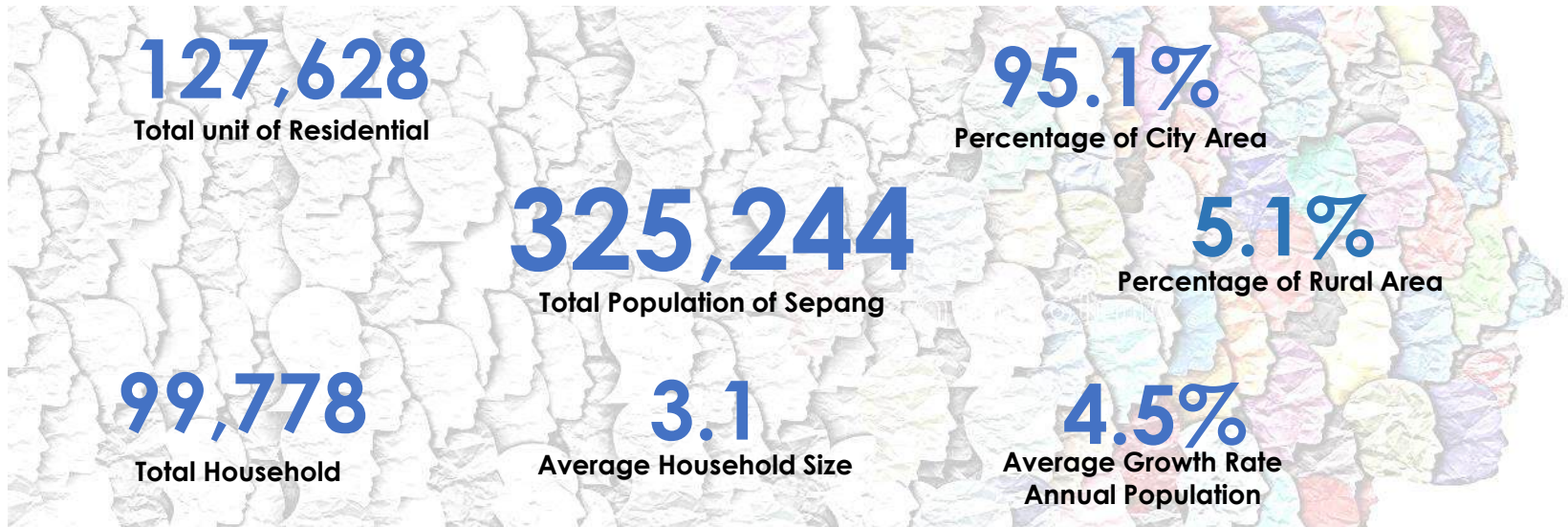
Selangor state, spans an expansive area of 61,900 hectares (61.9 square kilometers). Globally recognized for hosting the Kuala Lumpur International Airport (KLIA), the Sepang International Circuit (SIC), and Cyberjaya City, Sepang has gained international prominence. Additionally, it boasts various natural attractions, including Bagan Lalang Beach and Sungai Sepang Besar Mangrove Forest Reserve, making it a sought-after tourist destination in Malaysia.

With rapid development underway, Sepang has emerged as a key investment hub within Selangor state. The district features a 40% built-up area comprising residential, commercial, and industrial properties. Its strategic location, bordering the federal administrative center of Putrajaya and a mere 30-minute drive from the capital city of Kuala Lumpur, enhances its appeal. Furthermore, Sepang benefits from a robust infrastructure network and an extensive public transportation system, ensuring convenient accessibility throughout the district.

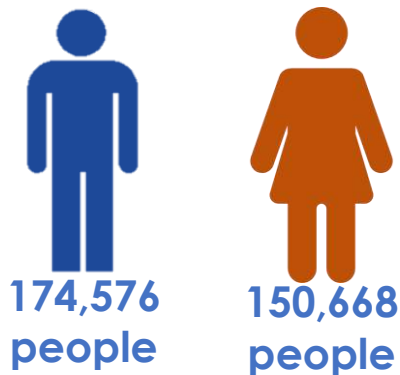
2.1 SEPANG DEMOGRAPHY

Sepang district is home to a predominantly active and working population, with 68.29% of individuals falling within the age range of 15 to 59 years old. The elderly population, on the other hand, constitutes 9% of the total population in Sepang. Notably, Sepang exhibits the highest population growth rate among all districts in Selangor, standing at an impressive 4.5%. This significant figure clearly signifies the district's rapid development and establishes it as a favored destination for property ownership, particularly for residential and industrial investments.

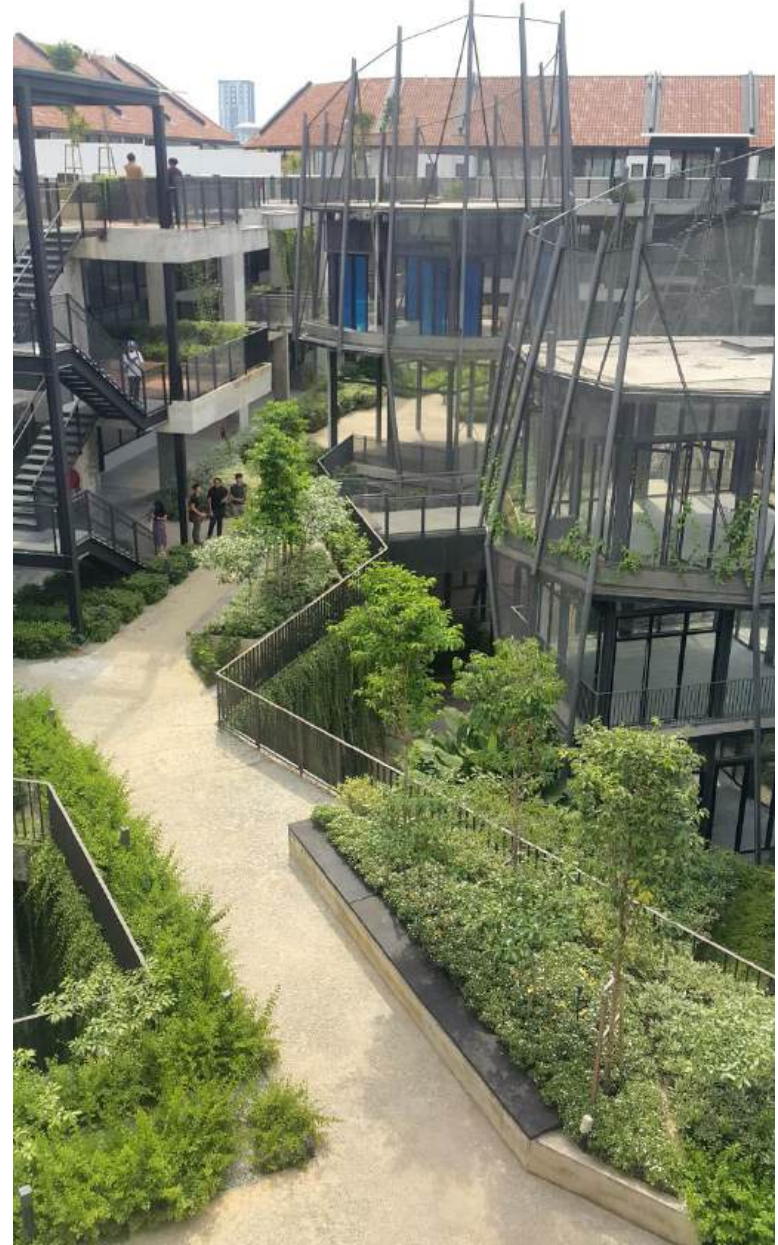
2.3 DEVELOPMENT TREND

Sepang comprises three sub-districts: Dengkil, Labu, and Sepang. However, the primary development focus lies on the Dengkil sub-district, situated in the northern part of Sepang, which has now expanded to include the area of Bandar Baru Salak Tinggi. This emphasis is driven by the numerous development potentials and investment opportunities offered by Cyberjaya and Kuala Lumpur International Airport, Sepang. Additionally, Sepang also benefits from spill-over development from neighboring areas, namely the Federal Territory of Putrajaya and Subang Jaya city.

The progress of development in Sepang is evident through the growth of established settlements such as Kota Warisan, 16 Sierra, Putra Perdana, and Sepang Putra. Furthermore, this growth is further strengthened by the emergence of several new urban centers and cities that are currently undergoing active development.

MPSepang is dedicated to the holistic and progressive development of Sepang, aiming to create a city that caters to the requirements of both its residents and investors. 2.4 DEVELOPMENT PROSPECT

Selangor has further solidified its standing by implementing investment strategies, notably through its involvement in the Integrated Development Region in South Selangor (IDRISS) plan. This initiative holds the potential to usher in significant economic transformations for Sepang. The state government's objective is to introduce high-impact projects to the southern region of Selangor, shifting the previous investment focus away from the Klang Valley region. Under the IDRISS development framework, projects will receive state government support and facilities through Managed Industrial Parks, along with investor incentives via the Green Fast Lane for streamlined development approvals.

3.0 SEPANG SDGs ROADMAP

Recognizing the significance of **cities** and **communities**, Malaysia SDG Cities acknowledges their pivotal role in shaping the trajectory and strategies for effectively achieving the goals and targets of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).



With the objective of aligning with this vision, the Sepang SDGs Roadmap was developed in 2022, benefiting from the guidance and advisory services provided by Urbanice Malaysia. This report underwent a comprehensive process, encompassing information gathering and analysis of the sustainability-focused initiatives implemented in Sepang. The development of an action plan for the immediate implementation of SDGs at the local level in Sepang employed a dual approach, incorporating inputs from both grassroots and higher-level perspectives.

The formulation of this report entailed a participatory process involving various stakeholders, including MPSepang's management, the establishment of the SDG's Thinker Task Force within MPSepang, stakeholders, and the local community. Through this collaborative approach, suitable SDG targets, strategies, and action plans were identified specifically for the local context.

This approach has not only allowed Sepang to identify existing gaps in its approach but also to understand the specific needs of the local community. Malaysia SDG Cities has provided valuable support to MPSepang in setting the direction for district development by integrating a global perspective into local action. The production of the Sepang SDG's Roadmap report signifies an ongoing commitment and dedication to the implementation of SDGs within the Sepang district.

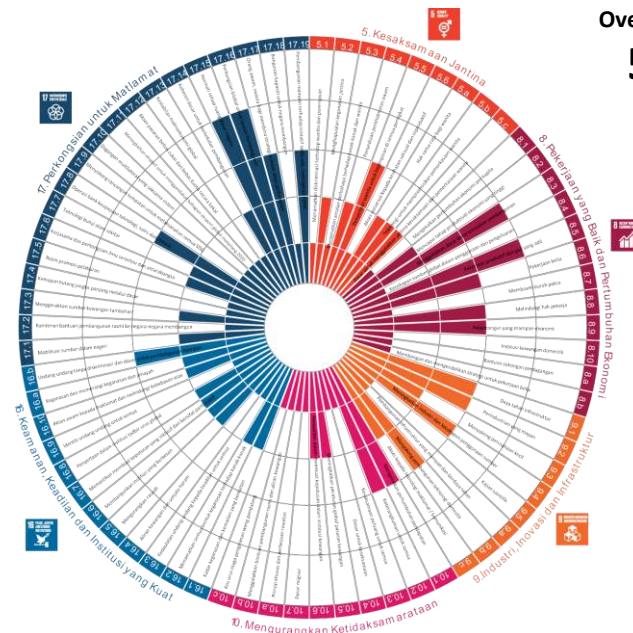

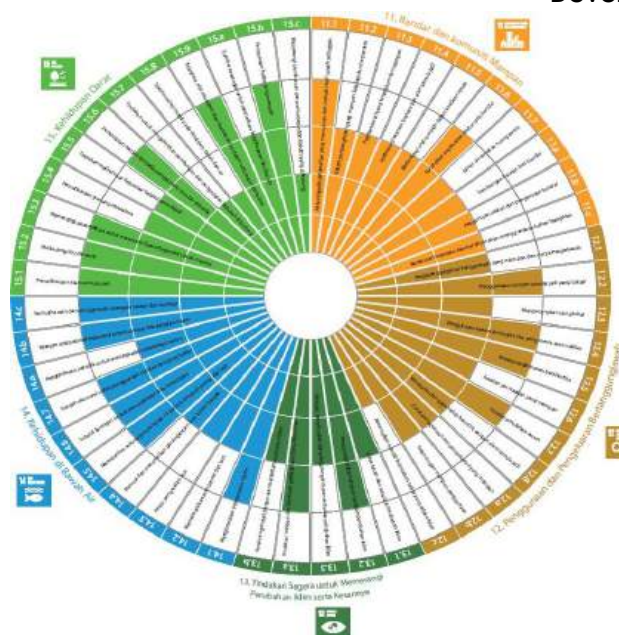

3.3 SELECTION OF SEPANG SDGs CHAMPION

The Sepang VLR 2023 report will focus on showcasing the progress of 5 selected SDGs, namely SDG1, SDG8, SDG9, SDG11, and SDG12, which have been identified as champions for reporting purposes. Through a comprehensive scoring analysis, it has been determined that Sepang has made commendable progress in these 5 SDGs, contributing to the realization of the sustainability vision in the district. To ensure effective implementation, the SDGs in Sepang have been divided into two phases based on a prioritization assessment.

The determination of the SDG implementation phases in Sepang and the selection of Sepang SDGs Champions were based on three primary methods. The first method involved utilizing the Rapid Integrated Assessment (RIA) matrix to measure MPSepang's policies and programs implemented in Sepang. From this assessment, a total of 8 SDGs achieved a score of 60%, indicating their significance compared to the remaining 9 SDGs. Furthermore, the selection process also considered the alignment with SDGs at the Federal and State levels, as well as the core services (back to basics) provided by MPSepang.



3.4 FINDINGS AND SUMMARY

In total, the Sepang SDGs Roadmap has formulated 83 targets, 142 strategies, and 309 action plans encompassing the 17 SDGs, all aimed at achieving sustainable development goals. The determination of each strategy and action plan has been grounded in realism, taking into account valuable insights garnered from engagement sessions conducted by MP Sepang management with stakeholders and local communities. The inputs gathered during these sessions ensured the feasibility and practicality of the strategies and action plans outlined in the roadmap.

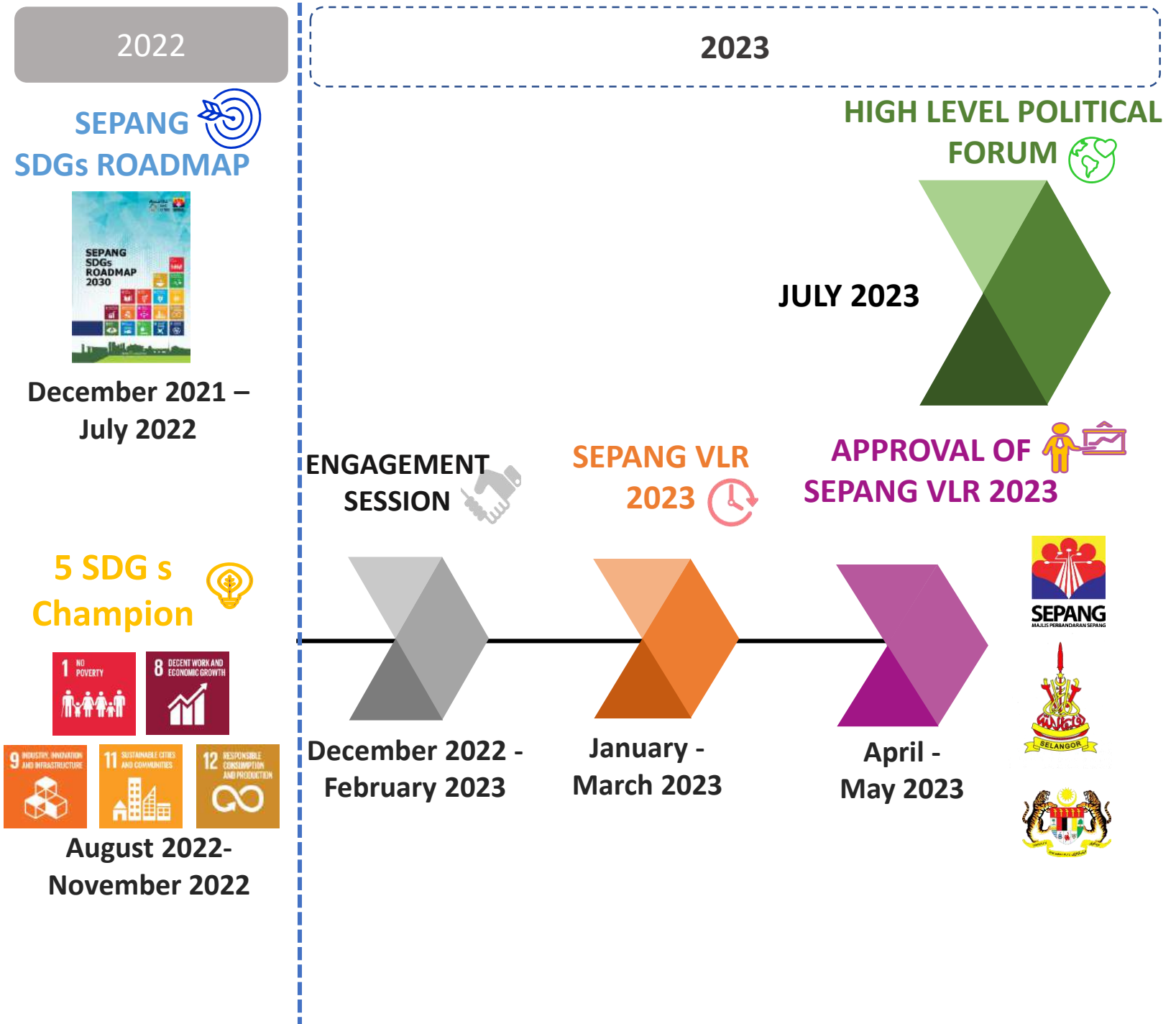

4.0 PROGRESS OF SDG IN SEPANG

Selang has carefully identified and prioritized 5 specific SDGs that play a vital role in fostering positive impacts on the Economy, Society, and the Environment. These 5 SDGs, namely SDG 1: No Poverty, SDG 8: Decent Work and Economic Growth, SDG 9: Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure, SDG 11: Sustainable Cities and Communities, and SDG 12: Responsible Consumption and Production, have been chosen based on their unique strengths and potential to contribute to the achievement of the 2030 Sustainable Agenda in Selang.

HIGH IMPACT PROJECTS

Rejuvenation of Bandar Baru Salak Tinggi (BBST) Program



As part of the Bandar Baru Salak Tinggi (BBST) Urban Design Study, this project contributes to the overall initiative aimed at enhancing and revitalizing the area's image. Known as BBST Walk@Sepang, this project has proven to be a resounding success, leaving a profound impact on the town's image and the local community's economy. Serving as a vibrant social space, BBST Walk@Sepang incorporates various developmental elements, including cultural stages, public squares, 22 stalls, and art lanes adorned with captivating murals showcasing local tourism products and nostalgic children's games. To ensure functionality and aesthetics, this project also features comprehensive infrastructure facilities such as bicycle paths, pedestrian walkways, and beautifully landscaped areas.

Having commenced operations in December 2021, BBST Walk@Sepang has become a focal point for community engagement, hosting a range of programs and activities. Notably, it has been a hub for weekly market events like the Pasar Tani and Car Booth Sale. Moreover, ongoing efforts to rejuvenate the main entrance further enhance the project's appeal. These include landscape upgrades at the entrance and central median, as well as improvements to street lighting infrastructure.

4.1 HIGH IMPACT PROJECTS

Nature Trail Program @Bagan Lalang



The natural tourism assets of Bagan Lalang Beach and the mangrove forests of Sungai Sepang Besar and Sungai Sepang Kecil in the southern part of the district hold great importance and require effective preservation. Recognizing this, MPSepang has fulfilled its responsibilities by undertaking maintenance, upgrading, and new development initiatives for public facilities, including food courts, hawker centers, and other amenities, to enhance the visitor experience in both areas.

Furthermore, various programs and activities focused on ecosystem conservation have been implemented. These include the Sungai Sepang Besar river tour program, beach cleaning initiatives, and mangrove planting programs carried out in collaboration with diverse agencies, educational institutions, and non-governmental organizations (NGOs). To promote eco-tourism, MPSepang also organizes the annual Bagan Lalang Beach Festival, which features a range of engaging activities.

Through these concerted efforts, MPSepang aims to maintain the natural beauty and ecological balance of these areas while providing enjoyable experiences for visitors, showcasing the district's commitment to sustainable tourism and environmental preservation.

Recycling Program @Sepang

The Recycling Program implemented by MPSepang has garnered recognition at both local and international levels for its effective solid waste management practices. Through innovative design, the products developed as part of the Sepang recycling program are not only user-friendly but also contribute to environmental protection by facilitating the creation of new recycled items.

One notable product from the program is Kitar Semula Minyak Masak Terpakai (KISMAT), which converts used cooking oil into Aedes Biobased Fuel (ABBF) as a substitute for diesel. This innovative solution serves the purpose of fogging to control dengue, as MPSepang repurposes ABBF for this specific application. ABBF has been patented and is currently processed by MPSepang at the Innovation Center @Sepang. Furthermore, the MPSepang recycling program has yielded various other products, including: -

4.1 HIGH IMPACT PROJECTS

Integrated Pedestrian / Bicycle Lane Project

The inception of the pedestrian and bicycle lane project in Sepang dates back to 2015, driven by the objective of encouraging healthy activities and mitigating carbon emissions resulting from motor vehicle usage. A user-friendly approach was adopted to ensure the provision of safe urban elements and comprehensive infrastructure. This facility has been successfully implemented in two urban areas, namely Cyberjaya and Bandar Baru Salak Tinggi, and has also been incorporated into the development plans of Bandar Serenia. Furthermore, it is now mandatory for all new developments to include pedestrian and bicycle lanes within their respective areas of development.



Urban Farming @Sepang

The Community Garden Program in the Sepang District is an ongoing initiative and commitment led by the Sepang Municipal Council. It was launched in 2012 to foster community engagement and promote gardening practices at the local level throughout the district. Currently, there are 33 active community gardens in Sepang, overseen by residents' associations, Joint Management Bodies of buildings, schools, and individuals. To further encourage and acknowledge community participation, MPSepang has also established a garden activity called 'myofficemyfarm' within the MPSepang building yard. Additionally, the annual Anugerah Kebun Komuniti @Sepang (AKS) event has been held since 2018 to recognize and celebrate the achievements of these community gardens.

MPsepang has implemented a range of entrepreneurship programs to empower and strengthen the economy of Sepang residents. Through the MPSepang Entrepreneurship Program initiative, several key programs have been introduced to tap into business opportunities. These include the provision of additional business spaces and online platforms, training and mentoring for aspiring entrepreneurs, and expanding market access for local businesses. These programs also involve collaborations with Platform Selangor (PLATS) to further support the entrepreneurial ecosystem in Sepang.

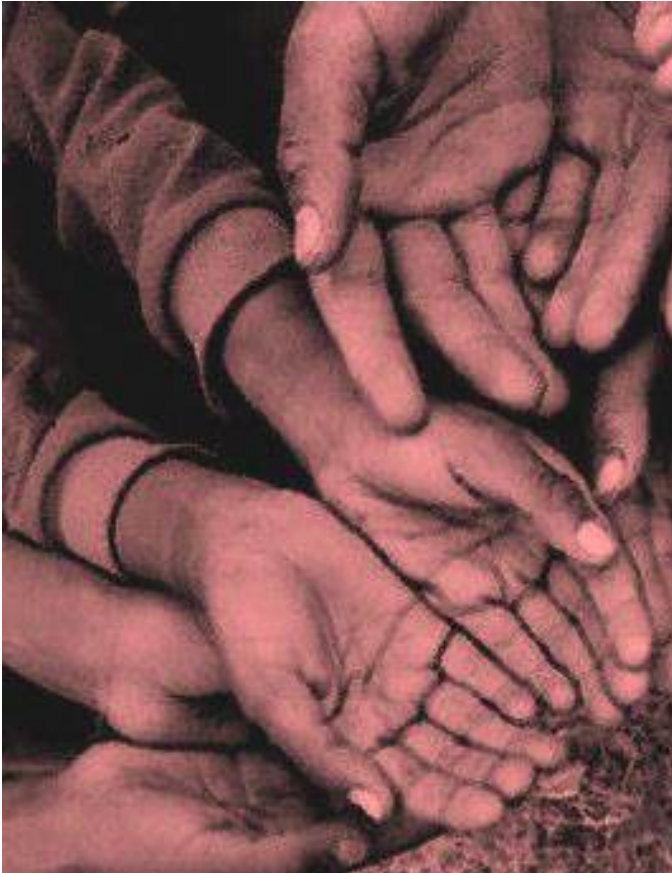

INTRODUCTION

Within Malaysia, individuals experiencing poverty are categorized into two groups: those classified as poor and those classified as extremely poor. This classification is based on the monthly income of households falling below the Poverty Line Income set by the government.

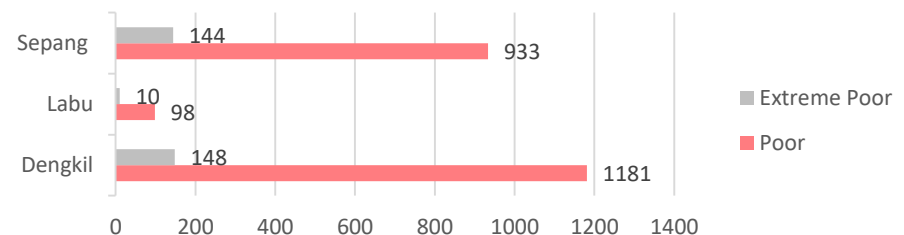

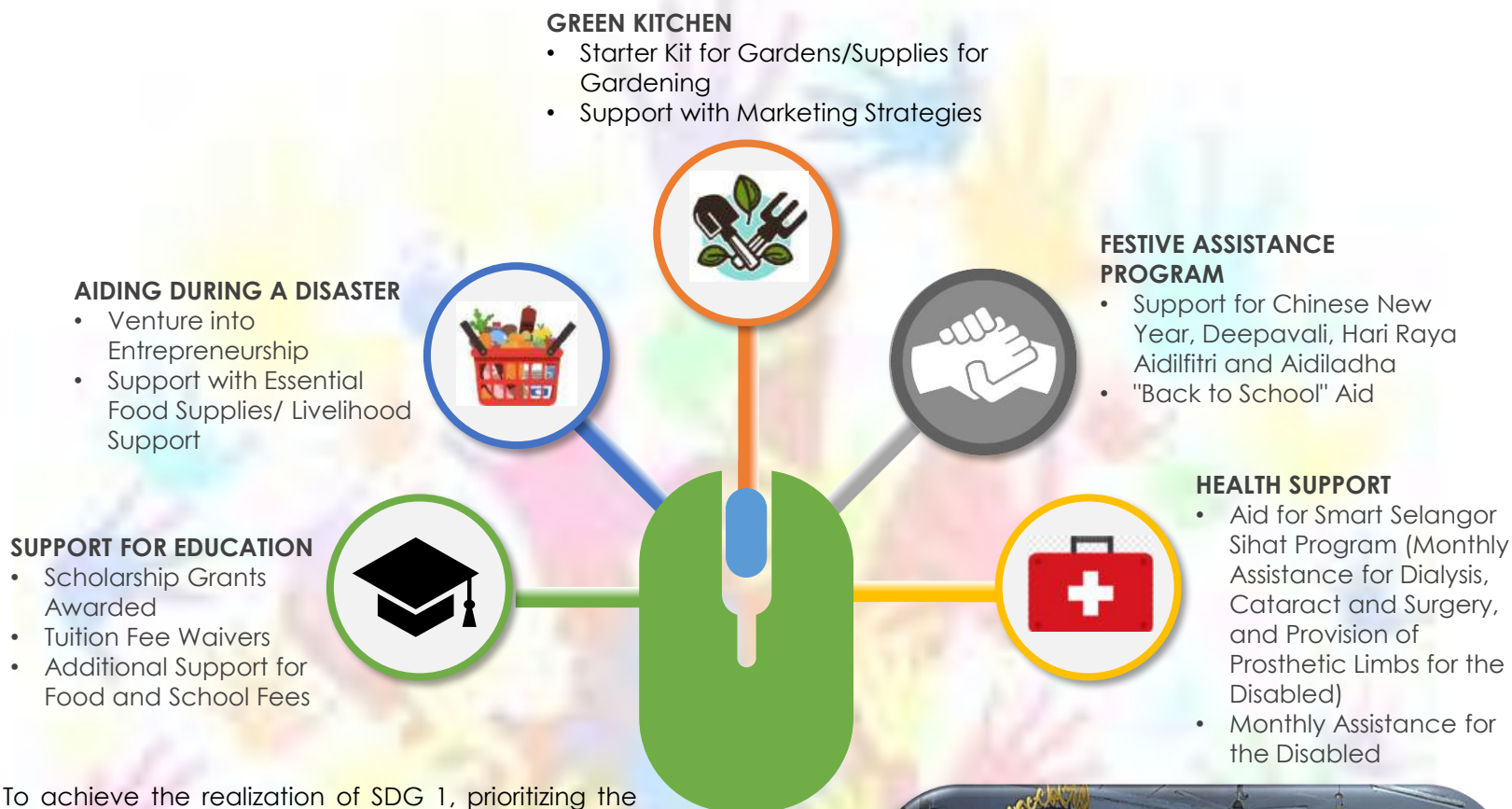

Noteworthy initiatives such as KLIA, Bandar Serenia, Cyberjaya, and Cybersouth have played a pivotal role in bolstering employment opportunities and facilitating population growth in Sepang District, given its favorable proximity to key urban centers like Putrajaya and Kuala Lumpur.

In 2022, there has been a significant increase in the number of license approvals, with 13,786 approvals compared to 11,021 in 2021. This reflects a substantial 25% growth during the economic recovery phase. The empowerment programs introduced during this phase have not only contributed to the district's economic revitalization but have also created job opportunities, underscoring their positive impact.

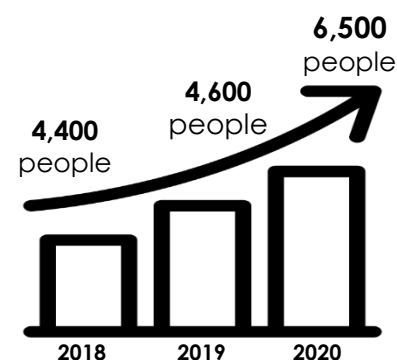

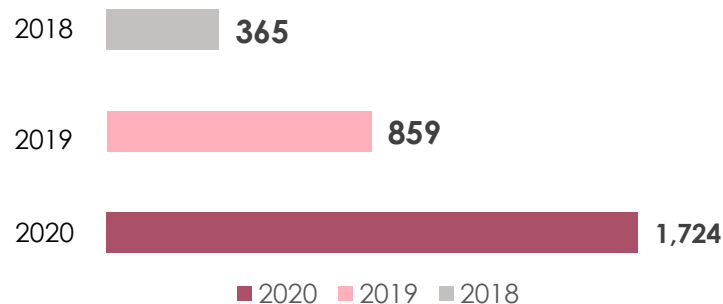

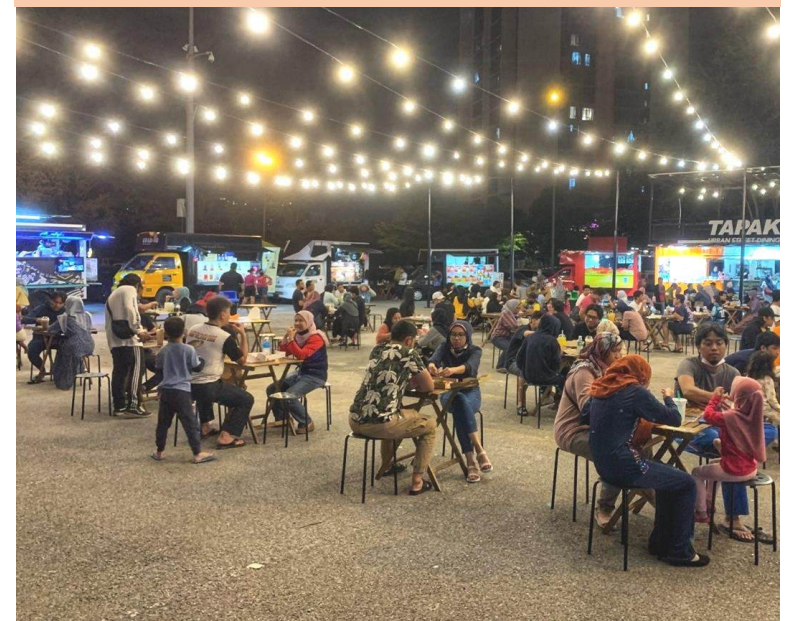

The industrial sector plays a crucial role in driving local economic growth and creating job opportunities, particularly for the community. Well-planned industrial development, supported by complete and comprehensive infrastructure facilities, has the potential to attract significant investments to the Sepang District.

In Sepang District, industrial land use covers a total of 5,240.56 acres or 3.43% of the total Sepang District (152,957.60 acres). Notably, Sepang achieved the highest investment in the State of Selangor in 2021, primarily driven by the domestic manufacturing sector, which attracted RM 1.7 billion in investments and created 3,181 job opportunities within the industrial sector.

The performance and development of investment in Sepang became even more prominent when Sepang was directly involved with the Integrated Development Region in South Selangor project or Integrated Development Region Plan in South Selangor (IDRISS) introduced by the Selangor State Government through Invest Selangor. This project is one of the efforts to attract high-impact investment in the southern area of Selangor by private developers with the offer of various incentives by the State and Federal Governments.

Sepang District also has a comprehensive road network system and is operated by various highways. In addition, the public transport system in Sepang consists of various modes of public transport such as ERL, MRT and buses including the Selangor Smart Free Bus.

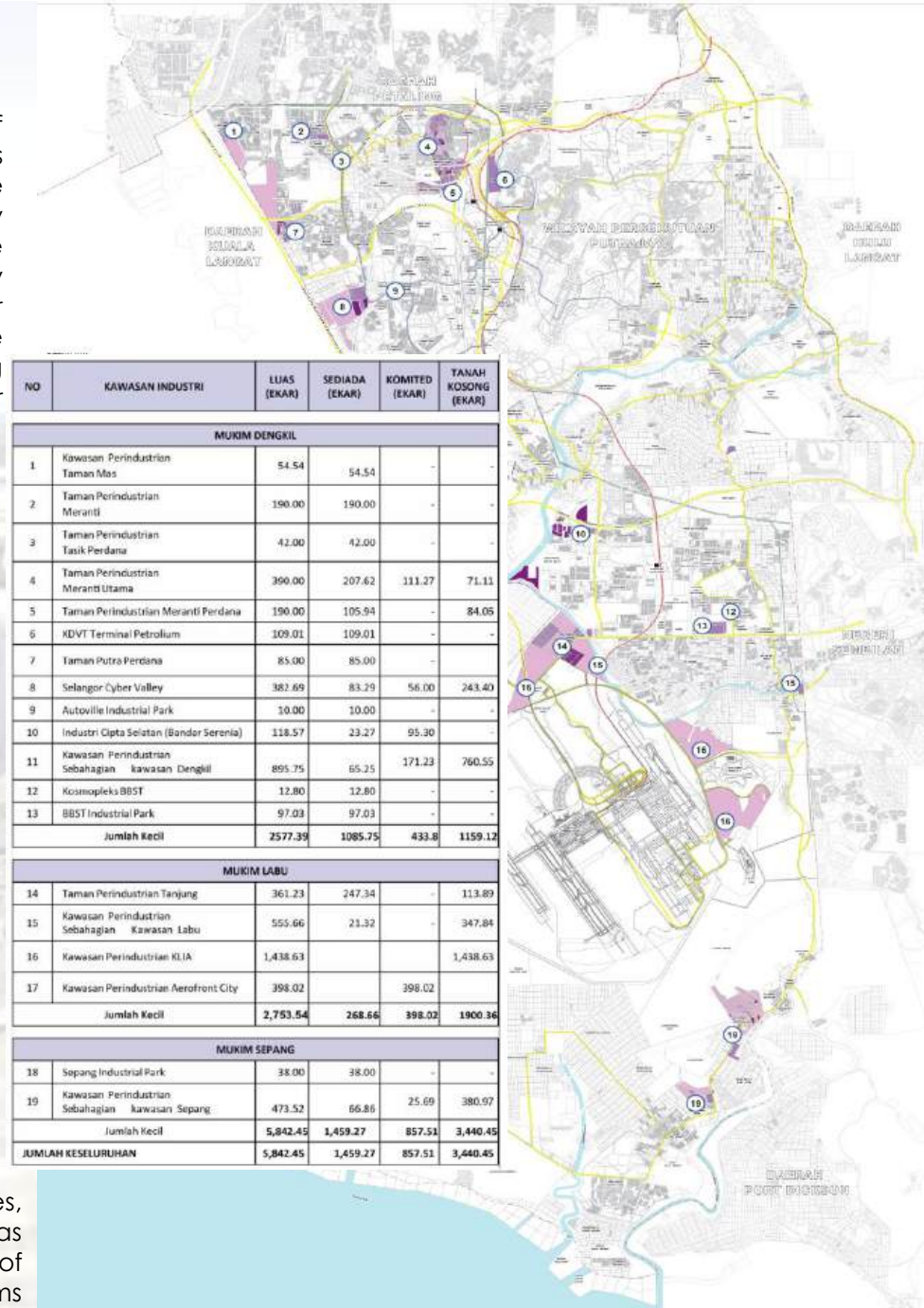

Furthermore, these measures have far-reaching effects on social and environmental sustainability, fostering a favorable and sustainable ecosystem for businesses to thrive in Sepang.

03 TELECOMMUNICATION ACCESS

The insufficient coverage of the telecommunications network, particularly in terms of internet access, has had a significant impact on the operational efficiency of the industry.

04 INFRASTRUCTURE AND UTILITIES MAINTENANCE

The industrial area in Sepang faces several key issues, primarily pertaining to infrastructure maintenance such as roads and drainage systems. Additionally, the lack of systematic solid waste management has led to problems such as flash floods and the presence of illegal garbage within the industrial area.

01 | Industrial Park Management Committee (IPMC)

The Industrial Park Management Committee (IPMC) in Sepang District serves as a platform for collaboration and coordination between local authorities and representatives of the industrial area. Its primary objective is to regulate and facilitate the maintenance, management, and growth of the industrial sector. In line with this, MPSepang has established an investment unit and appointed a dedicated investment officer to enhance efforts in attracting both local and international investors to Sepang.

03 | Alternative Energy Sources

Striving for a low-carbon city, Sepang is intensifying its initiatives by implementing solar panels on reservoirs, buildings, and private land to harness renewable energy sources. These installations aim to generate alternative energy and reduce reliance on traditional power sources.

05 | High-tech maintenance

In order to enhance infrastructure maintenance efficiency, MPSepang has proactively adopted advanced technology and equipment. Modern machinery, such as Jetpatcher for road patching (pothole repair) and robotic technology for drainage maintenance, has been utilized to streamline these operations.



02 | Telecommunications Coverage Network

In a collaborative effort with the Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission, MPSepang has embarked on an initiative to enhance the telecommunications network in the Sepang District. This includes ensuring comprehensive 4G and 5G coverage, particularly in Cyberjaya. The measures undertaken involve replacing conventional street lights with multifunctional street lights and the installation of telecommunication poles by service network providers.

04 | Integrated Utility Reserve

To streamline the telecommunications and internet networks, there is a plan to establish an integrated mains utility reserve, also known as common trenching. This initiative will be coordinated with the Selangor Utility Corridor (KUSEL) to ensure efficient infrastructure development and management.

06 | Awareness Programme for Property Care

Promoting a culture of public property stewardship and maintenance at the community level in the Sepang district.

Aerospace Industry

The aerospace industry has been identified as one of the strategic and impactful industries to drive the country's economic growth in the manufacturing and maintenance, repair and operation (MRO) segments, technological research, employee skill development and new job opportunities.

Selangor, with its strategic location as the nation's primary aviation hub housing KLIA, is poised to lead the aerospace industry. The availability of undeveloped land surrounding KLIA presents an opportunity to fulfill the demand from both existing and new industry players seeking to establish their regional operations in Malaysia.



The proposed Selangor International Aero Park development in Sepang aims to create an investor-friendly industrial zone, acting as a catalyst for the country's aerospace industry. This comprehensive development encompasses various components, including:

- a) **Maintenance, repair and operation (MRO) center**
- b) **Aircraft design, Engine manufacturing and aircraft spare parts**
- c) **Research and development center for aerospace technology**
- d) **Offices dealing with the operations of aerospace industry players**

- f) **Green Industry in terms of energy efficiency**
- g) **Employee Innovation and Excellence Training Center**
- h) **Employee accommodation equipped with sustainable facilities**
- i) **Integrated public transport network**

RESILIENT ROAD SYSTEM

Selangor is committed to ensuring the proper maintenance and regular upkeep of the roads under its jurisdiction. In pursuit of this goal, Selangor has set a specific objective of achieving zero potholes by 2030.

The Jetpatcher, an advanced equipment designed for quick pothole repairs using cold pavement techniques.

For regions where heavy machines and vehicles are used, the concrete pavement approach is the best option. Although this approach involves higher initial costs, it proves more cost-effective in terms of maintenance over the long term.

Furthermore, Selangor aims to enhance the traffic infrastructure by upgrading the existing traffic lights to Smart traffic lights, which will be integrated into the Council's traffic management system. Additionally, the installation of CCTV cameras in specific locations will further enhance monitoring capabilities..

High-tech and resilient infrastructure and utilities maintenance

FLOOD WARNING SYSTEM

A comprehensive and interconnected drainage system is essential to address the challenges posed by flash floods and backflow in small-scale development areas, including pocket developments such as residential, commercial, and industrial areas.

The implementation of flood early warning systems plays a crucial role in mitigating the adverse impacts of floods on communities. These systems provide timely information to the public regarding upcoming flood risks, enabling individuals to take appropriate preventive measures.

The Selangor Irrigation and Drainage Department (SID) has successfully implemented the installation of the system in the major rivers of Sepang district, namely Sungai Langat, Sungai Labu, Sungai Jenderam, and Sungai Rasau.

The utilization of robotic technology proves to be an excellent solution for maintaining the drainage systems, particularly in closed drains and narrow spaces, ensuring effective cleaning and maintenance.



EXPANDING TELECOMMUNICATION NETWORK SYSTEM

Through the replacement of multipurpose lampposts and the construction of new telecommunication tower structures in Cyberjaya, the Council and the State Government's subsidiaries have worked to provide a comprehensive 4G/5G telecommunication network system that will be extended to specific industrial areas. This will improve the communication and internet connectivity capabilities of the Sepang district.





A sustainable city is one that is well-managed, provides residents with adequate facilities and effective services, and meets their diverse needs across various areas such as the economy, social context, health, and education. When it comes to SDG 11, the focus extends beyond sustainable development to ensure a thriving community and a high quality of life for the people living in Sepang.

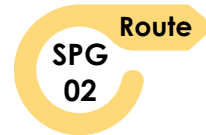

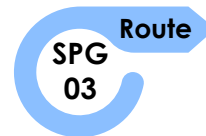

Affordable Home Housing

The Selangor State Government has introduced a new housing concept which is Affordable Housing which provides more comfort in terms of size and design. There are 3 initiatives that have been implemented namely:

01 Rumah Selangorku

Rumah Selangorku is a housing scheme designed to support low and moderate income groups introduced by the Selangor State government for Selangor people. The housing scheme of the Selangorku Affordable House project has been prepared and targets those who earn RM 3,000 to RM 10,000 per household per month. Since 2018, a remarkable achievement has been reached in Sepang, with a total of 24,428 Rumah Selangorku units successfully completed and made available to residents.

02 My First Home Scheme (SRP)

My First Home Scheme (SRP) is a Government initiative to help first home buyers to own a home. The banks participating in the scheme will carefully evaluate and process loan/financing applications based on the criteria set forth by the Scheme, as well as their own credit underwriting standards. Once approved, the loans/financing will be disbursed to the eligible applicants. This is an opportunity for applicants to take advantage of incentives from the government where applicants can get a 100% loan without having to provide 10% capital from the house price.

03 i-Milik

i-Milik offers a valuable stamp duty exemption incentive on transfer documents and loan agreements for first-time homebuyers, with the exemption amount being based on the purchase price of the property. This initiative aims to alleviate the financial burden associated with purchasing a first house. For houses priced at RM500,000 and below, the stamp duty exemption incentive is 100%, meanwhile for houses priced above RM500,000 up to RM1 million, the exemption incentive is 50%

Public Transportation System

The Sepang Municipal Council has collaborated with the Selangor State Government in providing public transportation facilities such as the SMART Selangor Bus, MRT, and ERL in Sepang to facilitate the movement of the local community to their destinations. Based on the public transportation study that has been conducted, there are 4 SMART Selangor Bus routes and 10 buses that have been provided by the Sepang Municipal Council.

Provision of User-Friendly Public Facilities

To enhance the community's well-being, MPSepang has thoughtfully provided accessible and user-friendly public facilities, including halls, community centers, and open spaces. Additionally, MPSepang has taken the initiative to establish social facilities like the BBST Walk @ Sepang, which fosters social interactions and strengthens community ties. These efforts aim to create an inclusive and vibrant environment for the residents of Sepang

Social Program with the Sepang Community

The input and perspectives of the community hold great significance in decision-making processes, ensuring that all plans and proposals put forth by MPSepang effectively address municipal and social challenges. 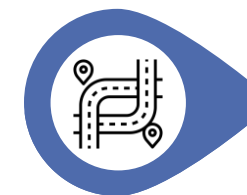

By empowering stakeholders and introducing recycling centers, we anticipate a substantial reduction in solid waste production by 2030. This approach not only ensures environmental sustainability but also promotes public health and well-being.

Waste composition in Malaysia



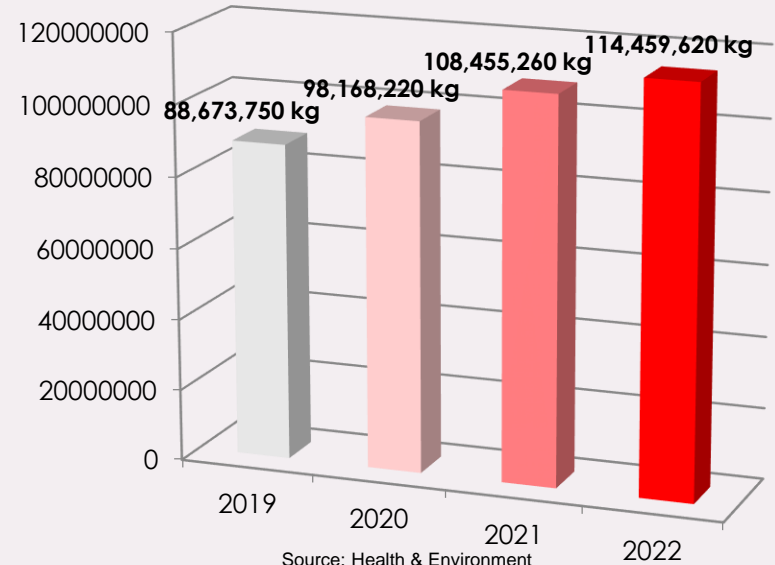

READINESS OF SEPANG COMMUNITY

Despite the recycling campaigns being actively conducted in the country for nearly three decades, the level of public response remains relatively low. According to statistics from the National Solid Waste Management Department (JPSPN) in 2021, the recycling rate in Malaysia stood at 31.52%, whereas many developed nations have achieved rates of at least 60%. Unfortunately, Sepang district is no exception to this challenge, as it only managed to achieve a recycling rate of 10% in 2022.

TECHNOLOGICAL INFRASTRUCTURE

The conversion of solid waste into valuable resources requires the support of the latest technology. This initiative requires collaboration from experts and R&D that can help produce innovative products that are advanced.

However, keeping up with the rapid pace of technological advancements poses a challenge for MPSepang. For instance, technical issues and the unavailability of replacement parts in the local market have rendered the existing Anaerobic Digester (AD) machine non-operational. This limitation hinders MPSepang's ability to produce compost fertilizer from food waste.

EFFICIENCY IN WASTE MANAGEMENT

Ensuring efficient waste management demands a strong commitment to human resource management, financial management, and logistics. The effectiveness of waste management is also influenced by the diverse operational locations spanning urban and rural areas

The production of compost fertilizer took place in Hutan Bandar, Cyberjaya, where it underwent a 6-month processing period. The resulting compost fertilizer was then utilized for landscaping purposes in Cyberjaya.

Innovation Centre @Sepang (PIS)



PIS, an ABBF plant and processing facility, converts used cooking oil into biodiesel. Under the KISMAT program, the collected used cooking oil is transported to PIS where it undergoes filtration and processing to transform it into biodiesel.

Mudball Programme



Mudball program was carried out at the Retention Pond of Persiaran Semarak Api, Cyberjaya.

Recycling Cage



A recycling bin has been installed at the Cyberjaya Community Club, Laman & Bayu Puchong, and SJK(T) Dengkil.

Cyberjaya Recycling Centre (PKSC)

RECYCLING USED COOKING OIL (KISMAT)

The **KISMAT** program, under the administration of MPSepang, plays a crucial role in preserving the environment and ensuring environmental cleanliness through the collection of used cooking oil from food premises and the community. This program has significant social and environmental benefits, including:

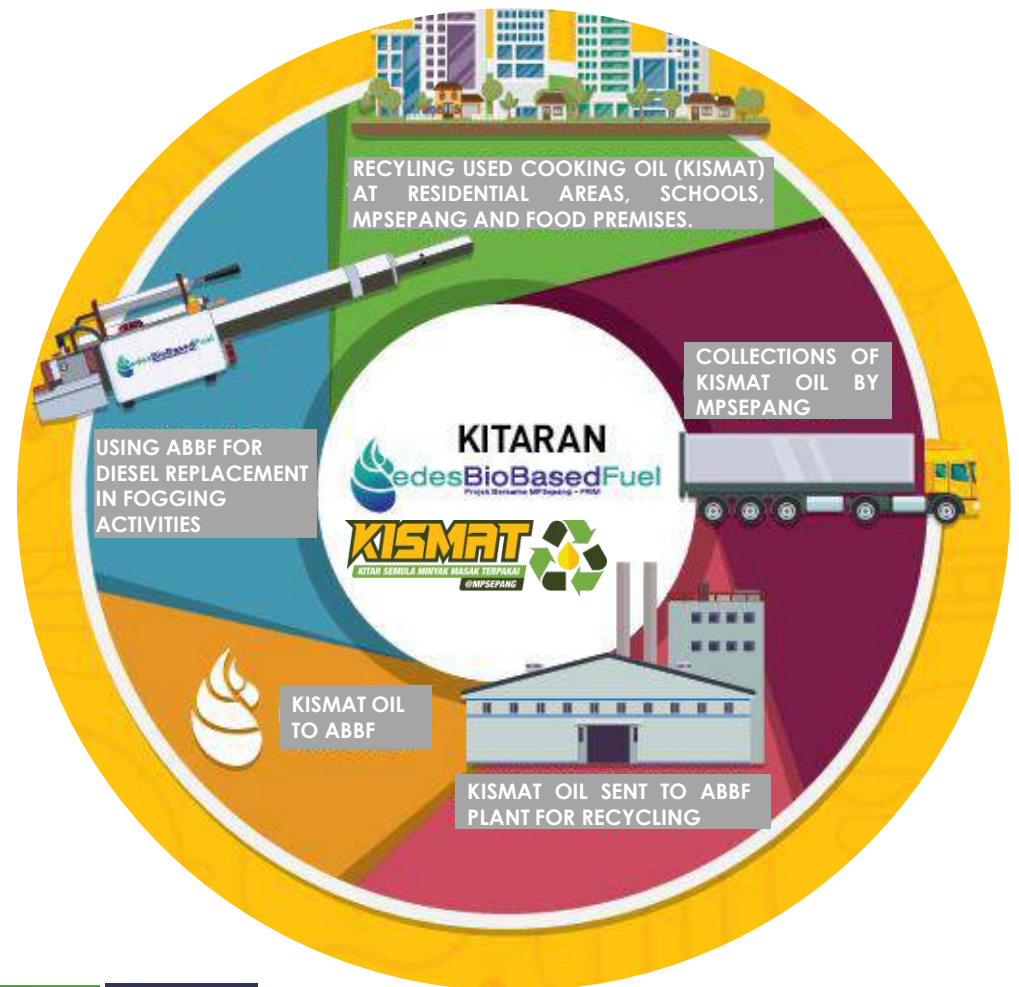
- Preventing pollution and environmental damage
- Mitigating pest and disease issues
- Adding value to wasted cooking oil
- Additional income to the community
- Generating additional income for the community

The **Aedes BioBased Fuel (ABBF)** innovation is derived from the conversion of used cooking oils. It serves as an eco-friendly alternative to traditional diesel fuel used in fogging operations for the control of dengue disease.

The advantages of ABBF are manifold. Firstly, it helps to minimize the health risks faced by fogging machine operators, ensuring their well-being during fogging activities. Secondly, ABBF acts as a specialized material for fogging, enhancing the effectiveness of disease control efforts. Furthermore, it adds value to the previously discarded used cooking oil collected through the KISMAT program, promoting resource utilization and sustainability. Lastly, the utilization of ABBF contributes to the enhancement of the social economy within communities, fostering economic benefits and growth.

❑ Fogging activities will use 100% of ABBF.

❑ Spread and commercialise ABBF to all local authority especially to local authority in Selangor.



COMPOSITION OF LANDSCAPE WASTE AND FOOD WASTE

Composting presents a natural and environmentally-friendly approach to recycle organic matter derived from both landscape waste and food waste. It involves a natural decomposition process facilitated by microorganisms in the presence of oxygen. Through this process, organic materials undergo decomposition, leading to the production of a reusable and environmentally beneficial natural fertilizer. The utilization of composting not only contributes to waste reduction but also promotes sustainable practices and nourishes the environment.

LANDSCAPE WASTE

Processing compost fertilizer from landscape waste has been effectively implemented at Hutan Bandar, Cyberjaya, and its expansion is planned for JPP Zones with community gardens. Opting for homemade composting materials as a means of recycling aims to minimize the environmental impact of landscape waste and promote green circular economy practices.

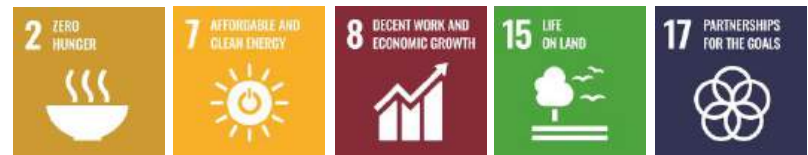
The compost fertilizer, after undergoing a minimum 6-month processing period, will be utilized for nourishing the soft landscape areas within the Cyberjaya development. This initiative not only demonstrates responsible waste management but also contributes to the sustainable beautification of the surroundings.

FOOD WASTE

MPSepang will collaborate with operators from food courts, commercial centers, and public markets to convert food waste into compost fertilizer using the Anaerobic Digester (AD) machine.

The operators will segregate the food waste and place it in designated containers for composting. Community gardens in JPP zones will combine landscape waste with food waste, and MPSepang will provide the resulting compost fertilizer.

This approach aims to reduce the amount of solid waste sent to disposal sites and alleviate the financial burden of tipping fees for MPSepang. Moreover, it indirectly extends the lifespan of solid waste disposal sites, promoting more sustainable waste management practices.
